Online System for Researcher Permits

Alberta Parks has an online process for our research and collection Permitting system. The online system has significantly reduced permit wait times and made the application process more streamlined and efficient.

The online system allows researchers and course instructors to create a user account, submit research and collection applications, and attach project proposals and required documents such as animal care committee forms, SRD permits, study area maps, etc. When the application is submitted, the online system immediately notifies the appropriate staff and the permit approval process is initiated. Depending on the level of detail in the application, a staff member may contact the applicant via email or telephone if any additional information is required. Once approved, the permit is issued and automatically sent to the applicants email address as a pdf file.

This process is required for all researchers and course instructors, regardless if there is "collection of specimens" or not.


