



Canada Research Chair (Tier II) in Disability Policy for Children and Youth, Faculty of Kinesiology and the School of Public Policy

The **Faculty of Kinesiology** and the **School of Public Policy** at the **University of Calgary** invite applications for a **tenure-track appointment as Assistant Professor in Disability Policy**. **The successful candidate will be nominated for a Canada Research Chair (Tier II) in Disability Policy for Children and Youth**. The CRC will integrate findings from fundamental science on child development, translational clinical research in kinesiology (including rehabilitation and behavior), and evaluation approaches in health services research to inform policy and systems change.

This is a full-time appointment and includes a 100% secondment to the School of Public Policy. A Ph.D. in a relevant discipline, such as Kinesiology, Psychology or Health Sciences, or within a related area of Public Policy, is required. We are looking for an emerging scholar with demonstrated ability to publish in recognized academic and policy venues and to attract significant grant support. The anticipated start date is July 1, 2019. The appointee will also contribute to teaching in the Master of Public Policy program and will supervise graduate students from the two units.

Tier II Chairs are intended for exceptional emerging scholars (i.e., candidates must have been an active researcher in their field for fewer than 10 years at the time of nomination). Candidates who are more than 10 years from having earned their highest degree and who have had career breaks, such as maternity, parental, or extended sick leave, clinical training, etc., may have their eligibility for a Tier II Chair assessed through the program's Tier II justification process. - Statement of research plans and objectives for the next three years
- Copies of relevant research papers
