



**Tier I Canada Research Chair in Translational Pain Research, Department of Anesthesiology,
Perioperative & Pain Medicine, Cumming School of Medicine**

The Department of Anesthesiology, Perioperative and Pain Medicine (<https://cumming.ucalgary.ca/anesthesiology/>) in partnership with the Hotchkiss Brain Institute (HBI) Cumming School of Medicine, University of Calgary, invites applications for an appointment with Tenure at the Professor level in chronic pain. The selected candidate will be nominated for a Canadian Institutes for Health Research (CIHR) Tier I Canada Research Chair (CRC) in Translational Pain Research. The successful candidate will establish an active research program that focuses on the development of an independent research program in the field of pain. In this regard, it is expected that the successful candidate will work collaboratively with the team of basic scientists, clinician investigators and clinicians conducting translational research within HBI, the Calgary Chronic Pain Centre (CPC), and the Department of Anesthesiology, Perioperative and Pain Medicine..

Qualifications include a MD and PhD, an outstanding record of research productivity with publications in high impact journals, success in the acquisition of external research funding and awards. The applicant must also meet the requirements outlined for the Canada Research Chair. Demonstrated leadership ability through program development and implementation will be valued. Contributions to trainee supervision, mentorship and teaching will be expected. An ability to initiate collaborations and work successfully in multidisciplinary teams is essential. Previous research experience spanning the spectrum of acute and chronic pain (acute to chronic) is an asset.

The successful candidate will join an established, multidisciplinary, and cross-faculty team of clinicians at the CPC. They will be expected, in collaboration with the health researchers committed to basic and translational research, to develop a clinical research program within the CPC and allied acute care facilities. Leadership opportunities for the appropriately qualified individual will be made available. The position provides 65% protected time for research and an excellent opportunity to establish a vigorous, sustainable, externally funded research program. The candidate will contribute to teaching and graduate student supervision within a dynamic and collaborative environment. The candidate will have access to state-of-the-art core infrastructure. Outstanding opportunities for collaboration are also available with established research programs within the HBI. A competitive salary and an attractive start-up package will be available through the CSM and the HBI.
