What to do if you find wildlife in trouble





Do not approach the animal

Injured or abandoned wildlife can still pose a threat to people when approached.



Write down as many details you can about the animal sighting

Note down the date, time, location, behaviour, and the direction the animal is travelling. This information will be crucial for trained individuals to know so they can perform a succesful rescue.



Take photos and videos

These are very helpful for determining the animal's species, as well as for assessing their condition.



Reach out to a wildlife organization near you
