The UCalgary Research Data Management Strategy Implementation Steering Committee (RDM Steering Committee) was convened on February 28 2024, and held one additional meeting in this reporting period, on March 28, 2024. Since then, the committee has met twice and established three working groups (Policies & Procedures, Sensitive Data, and Indigenous Data Sovereignty). b. The RDM Steering Committee has broad representation of senior University leaders across academic and business units, including the Provost’s Office, Vice-President (Research) Office, Research Services, IT, Libraries and Cultural Resources, Faculty of Graduate Studies, REB Chairs, and multiple Faculty Associate Deans (Research), as well as postdoctoral and graduate student representatives. c. During this period, the RDM Specialist supported the establishment of the RDM Steering Committee and its initial work, delivered 10 workshops or information sessions in collaboration with the RDM Librarian, and reviewed data management plans (DMPs) for

Through our existing research priorities and our focus on matching our research strengths with opportunities, we will increase international collaborations and expand opportunities for knowledge transfer for global impact. 	<p>\$195,000</p>	<p>We continued a comprehensive awareness campaign, ensuring that our faculty members and stakeholders remain well-informed about global opportunities relevant to their areas of expertise. Our cross-campus roadshow made 12 stops to spread the word on our services and connected with over 200 UCalgary researchers interested in exploring international research. We held consultations with 55 individual researchers to determine how we could support and grow their international collaborations. We developed Version 2 of our IFARM tool to find international funding opportunities for UCalgary researchers, sharing 290 grant calls with our researchers that aligned with their research interests. We also integrated our Researcher Database with the VPRO’s database, furthering our ability to connect UCalgary researchers with opportunities.</p> <p>Our external engagement activities have involved leveraging the extensive network of Canadian embassies and the diplomatic community to forge new research partnerships with strategically important nations. We supported the development of the Strategic Alliance with Curtin University in Australia and the University of Aberdeen in Scotland, connecting researchers in more than 50 different research areas. We assisted multiple missions and delegations to advance research collaborations and innovation. We became the focal point at UCalgary for participation in Horizon Europe, after Canada officially joined in December 2023.</p>

IER has facilitated four institutional, corporate research partnerships, with several more anticipated in the coming year.</p> <p>Coordinated by IER, the VP(Research) has provided several letters of support to companies applying for grants. One alumni-founded company who is partnered with UCalgary successfully received \$3M from Emissions Reduction Alberta to fund a \$6M agrivoltaics research facility at W.A. Ranches (announced at COP28 in Dubai in November 2023).</p> <p>In June 2023, IER took four UCalgary research units to BIO 2023 and represented many more. Over 200 new contacts were made and UCalgary research teams in health and life sciences are now working together closely to seek opportunities and cross-promote how our expertise can advance companies.</p>

To strengthen and identify existing resources for Indigenous communities, university researchers, and further partners to promote collaborative, reciprocal, and culturally responsive research.</p>	<p>\$470,000.00</p>	<p>In 2023-2024, the Indigenous Research Support Team (IRST) made significant strides in strengthening and identifying resources for Indigenous communities, university researchers, and partners.</p> <p>Through more than 34 diverse Indigenous research capacity-building programs, including workshops on Indigenous ethics, data sovereignty, and community engagement, IRST supported over 1,443 participants.</p> <p>The team also facilitated 174 direct consultations and played a key role in advancing institutional understanding of Indigenous research protocols.</p> <p>Special projects included developing Indigenous research resources, collaborating on an asynchronous D2L course on research ethics, piloting parallel ceremonial ethics review processes, and collaborating on national initiatives that promote culturally responsive research practices.</p>

Over 200 members of the campus community were reached across 9 workshops offered throughout the year, and 80+ consultations were offered to researchers, faculties, and colleagues. EDIA principles underscored the practices and processes by the team in their advising and engagement with members of the UCalgary research community.</p> <p>The team continued to align its scope and approach to institutional EDIA commitments in the research ecosystem, including the CRC-EDI Action Plan, the Dimensions EDI Action Plan, and the EDI Plan for Research and Teaching Awards. The team was also actively involved in the Research and Scholarship working group of Presidential Task Force on EDIA, which was tasked with developing recommended strategic priorities and actions to the task force for addressing barriers in the research ecosystem within the forthcoming institutional EDIA strategy and action plan.</p>
