Values exercises

Integrating knowledges, disciplinary approaches

- Are my research questions integrative?
 - are the research questions relevant to all researchers, participants?
 - Are they separated out? (one question of the NS, one for SSH, one for community partners etc)
- Does the work of different researchers *actually inform* the research others are doing **during the course of the project**?
 - Does the work a community researcher is doing inform the work of an engineer etc?
 - Are the methods integrated?
 - Do different researchers participate in the evaluations of each others' work?
- Thinking about project researchers as co-mentors
 - Include co-mentorship activities (teach-ins, workshops, knowledge sharing exercises, for example)
- Transdisciplinarity not as a one-and-done but as a process throughout the project

HQP and Transdisciplinarity

Who are the HQP? Who are the trainees in your project?

- Expanding the notion of an HQP
- Situating your project in place

Preparing trainees for a future of big transdisciplinary challenges

- Is transdisciplinary training built in for students/trainees? Or are they in silos?
- Opportunities for trainee co-mentorship
- Events that bring students out of their comfort zones
 - "challenge workshops," opportunities to present cross-sectorally, attend and learn from many project members, example of muskrat camp

Output that matters

- Opportunities for different kinds of output (academic pubs, but also popular writing, policy reports, working with partners for partner-specific output)
- Cross-sectoral, community collaboration opportunities


